The local transport in Mumbai is not actually in the bad condition, it is the population of passengers which makes it pathetic particularly during peak hours.

Other problems can be solved if people themselves understand this and stop pushing and hurting others. People should maintain peace and let others also get a chance. The another issue is those people hanging on doors this is the reason because of which rail accidents happen. Another thing that Mumbai railway community can do is extend the stoppage time and trains for the passengers. This will solve this problem to a large extent.

Recently metro has been started in some parts of city, it is on the verge of extension. Apart from this, monorail is also started in some places. But local trains are the lifeline of the people living in Mumbai. So any improvement in local trains will be really beneficial for the passengers.

While boys prefer to stay as paying guests because there are no boundaries on them and there is personal space too. According to female students, hostels are very few as compared to the population. According to the study, it was seen maximum hostel accommodations are in Andheri, few in Goregaon. Matunga and grant road has very old hostels too. Most of the outstation students live in Andheri according to the analysis because Andheri has the maximum number of paying guest accommodations and hostels. As there many students from Rajasthan, a separate hostel exists in Goregaon only for Rajasthan students who are pursuing CA.
Other	14	These were those students who had some of their close relatives in Mumbai. They live with them and so may not have to spend money on rent.
