THE HEALTH CONDITION OF TEA LABOURERS IN ASSAM: AN ANALYSIS

ABSTRACT

The tea industry, the single largest industry in Assam, is mainly labour-oriented. A large section of people is engaged in this sector. The total population of tea labour community is estimated to be about 20% of total population of Assam. But as per Assam Human Development Report of 2003, the health status of the tea labourers is much below the state average. It has been observed that the labourers have been facing multiple deprivations such as poor health care, malnutrition, illiteracy, poverty, unhygienic living habit etc. The tea planters usually tris to exploit them in every possible way for sucking their own profits. Therefore, there is a need to improve the living condition of tea labourers who are an unavoidable part of our economy without whom economic development of Assam become stabled.
