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## WAR CRIMES IN SRI LANKA

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## ABSTRACT

Sri Lanka has been marred by ethnic rivalry and internal armed conflict from the very beginning of its independence. But recently it occupied a central stage in the international arena for its war against the LTTE. This paper tries its best to rediscover the civil war in Sri Lanka with intent to know whether it has qualified to the extent that the International Humanitarian Laws (IHL), Laws of war or war crimes are applicable there. The focus of the paper is to look for the different crimes committed in the civil war with main focus on the crimes committed against the non-combatants in the last phases of war in 2009.
